

**COUNCIL BILL NO. 2017-105**

**ORDINANCE NO**

AN ORDINANCE approving an agreement with Allgeier, Martin & Associates not to exceed Eighty Five Thousand Two Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars (\$85,280.00) for Design Services Associated with the 2017 Public Infrastructure Improvements in the NID # IV Phase II Project and containing an emergency clause.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOPLIN, as follows:

Section 1. Approval of an agreement with Allgeier, Martin & Associates not to exceed Eighty Five Thousand Two Hundred Eighty and no/100 Dollars (\$85,280.00) for Design Services Associated with the 2017 Public Infrastructure Improvements in the NID # IV Phase II Project in the City of Joplin, Jasper County.

Section 2. Upon the final approval and acceptance of the consultant's work under said contract, in substantial conformance with the attached exhibits, in writing by the Director of Public Works, and his certification to that effect to the Director of Finance, the contractor shall be paid from the Community Development Block Entitlement Grant.

Section 3. That the Director of Public Works is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement on behalf of the City of Joplin with Allgeir, Martin & Associates.

Section 4. This ordinance is an emergency within the means of Section 2.12 (6) in that said ordinance provides for public improvements and is considered an emergency by the Council and as such shall become effective immediately upon this passage as provided by the Home Rule Charter for the City of Joplin. Specifically, this ordinance approves work to begin immediately in the optimal construction time during the calendar year, and appropriations for this contract have been approved by the 2016-2017 budget.
