**ITEM: RESOLUTION NO.** 2018-006; This Resolution allows for the Police Department to apply for three (3) grants through MODOT for the enforcement of DWI laws, as well as training and equipment to further our effort in reducing DWI crashes, as well as reducing crashes involving hazardous moving violations.

### INTRODUCTION:

The Joplin Police Department requests consideration of this Resolution. This request, if approved, would authorize applying for the acceptance and expenditure of grant funds between the City of Joplin and the Missouri Department of Transportation. There is a total of three grants totaling \$98,933. The first grant is for the funding of the Joplin Police Department's Full Time DWI Unit in the amount of \$66,038. This grant pays for 50% of salaries, benefits, and overtime for two officers that are currently assigned to this unit. The second grant is in the amount of \$16,700 and will be used to cover overtime costs and fringe benefit costs for Hazardous Moving Violation enforcement. The third grant is in the amount of \$16,195 and will be used to cover overtime costs and fringe benefit costs for DWI

Enforcement details and Youth Alcohol Enforcement details. Part of this grant will also cover for one officer to attend training at the annual LETSAC conference.

### SUMMARY /DISCUSSION:

The Joplin Police Department has received these grants for several years. We first received the grant to fund the full-time DWI unit in 2010. At that time, the grant was for 100% of funding of the DWI positions. The grant was reduced to 75% the following year and to 50% the next year. The original plan for this grant was to eliminate funding for the DWI positions after three years. Our DWI unit has been very successful and because of that, the positions have continued to be funded at 50%. Each year the Joplin Police Department's DWI Unit has led the State in DWI arrests when compared to other DWI units that are funded under the same grant. The second grant will be utilized to cover overtime costs and fringe benefits for

Hazardous Moving Violation details. These details are used to focus enforcement efforts on Hazardous Moving Violations that occur within the city limits of Joplin. The efforts are focused in high crash areas and they have been instrumental in keeping our crash numbers down each year. The third grant will be utilized to cover overtime costs and fringe benefits for DWI enforcement details. The focus of these details will be to make for a safer community by detecting and arresting drivers who are intoxicated.
